Rules And Regulations

A Student of H.S. Classes must attend at least 75% of the total classes held during the session and for a degree student 95% attendance is compulsory.

Wearing uniform is compulsory for students except on Thursday.

Students are strictly prohibited from leaving the college campus during the college hour.

Principal's decision in matters relating to maintenance of disciplines will be binding.

Any form of ragging is strictly prohibited. Such activities will be dealt with strictly.

The student should reach at College premises before 10-30 a.m. positively because the College gate will remain closed at that time.

Examination and Its Rules (Only for TDC Course) :
